


Welcomes New Athletic Director

Officers Recognized

Three Earn Life Saving Awards

Three Smithfield police officers were honored at Tuesday's Town Council meeting with Life Saving Awards. Mayor John Lampe presented medals to Officers (from left to right) Victor Denoble, Jordan Cutchins and Jeremy Stewart.

The officers were honored for saving the life of a shooting victim on May 10th. Police Chief Mike Scott said police

responded to a shooting at 2:55am in a parking lot at 1300 South Brightleaf Boulevard.



Officer Cutchins was the first to arrive on the scene, followed immediately by Officers Denoble and Stewart. Officer Cutchins located a man with six gun shot wounds to his torso and upper extremities.

Chief Scott said the victim was bleeding profusely. Officer Cutchins identified the most life threatening wounds and worked to stop the bleeding. Officers Denoble and Stewart each took a different set of wounds and applied first-aid that prevented additional massive blood loss until Johnston County Emergency Medical Services personel arrived.

SMITHFIELD YOUTH BASKETBALL - Registration begins September 15 for Youth Basketball. Basketball is open to boys ages 5-18, and girls ages 5-12. Council Meeting Highlights

September 02, 2014

Regular Meeting summary:

- 1. Mayor Lampe administered the oath of office to new Police Officer, Terry Douglas White.
- Mayor Lampe and Chief of Police Mike Scott presented Life Saving Awards.
 to Smithfield Police Officers R. Jeremy Stewart, Jordan Cutchins and Victor Denoble for their heroic actions on May Tenth, 2014 that resulted in the saving of a life.
- 3. Mayor Lampe presented a Proclamation declaring September 17th 23rd as Constitution Week to the following members of the Smith-Bryan Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution: Mary Aker, Janie Temple, Mary Fuller, and Phoebe Landfried
- 4. Mayor Lampe presented a Proclamation declaring September as Recovery Awareness Month to Rachel Ayers.
- 5. Andre' Nabors with the NC Department of Commerce made a presentation on the Retire NC Program.
- 6. Approved the Consent Agenda.
- 7. Approved a contract with NCO Financial Systems, Inc. for Online Bill Payment Services
- 8. Awarded the bid to VACALL and approved the purchase of a combination single engine sewer cleaner with positive displacement vacuum system for the Water/ Sewer Department.
- 9. The Council tabled a request to approve a contract for a Cost of Survey and rate study until January 2015.
- 10. The Council requested that informal bids be obtained for engineering services for a water system valve GPS and GIS digital mapping. \$6800 was approved for an asset management plan to be conducted.
- 11. Approved a budget amendment to upgrade the Brogden Road Substation's Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system.
- 12. Approved an increase in compensation for the members of the Planning Board and Board of Adjustments. The Planning Board will now receive \$50.00 per month and the Board of Adjustments will receive \$25.00 per meeting.
- 13. Approved to move forward with the West Smithfield Beautification Project.

The Town Council regularly meets the first Tuesday of each month beginning at 7:00pm at the Town Hall Council Chambers located at 350 East Market Street - unless rescheduled. The next Regular Council Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, October 7th. There will be a Special Meeting on Tuesday, September 16th @ 6pm for a forum to discuss electric rates.
