## Neighborhood Housing Rehabilitation Program

The Town of Smithfield has designated Johnston-Lee-Harnett Community Action to serve as the Town's Housing Selection Committee.

A map of the area under consideration follows.



The Town's Neighborhood Revitalization Housing Program must benefit owner occupied housing whose household income is less than 80% of Johnston County's. The Town's housing rehabilitation program provides deferred forgiwable loans that are proportionally forgiven over a period of time. The housing rehabilitation program provides up to \$38 per square foot of heated, occupiable space per house not to exceed \$40,000.

# JCPS Receives \$75K Education Innovation Fellowship

Five schools in Johnston County Public Schools were among the 20 selected across North Carolina to be a part of the 2018-2019 TrueSchool Innovation Fellow ship.

The project, fully funded by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, is an intensive, collaborative effort aimed at improving literacy among students, pre-kindergarten to 3rd grade.

The selected Johnston County schools include Micro, East Clayton, **West Smithfield**, Benson and Four Oaks elementary schools.

"Johnston County Public Schools is excited to be a part of the TrueSchool experience," said Brandon Garland, innovation officer for Johnston County Public Schools. "We believe this opportunity will benefit the students and staff of our participating schools."

The TrueSchool Innovation Fellowship provides a \$15,000 scholarship per school to cover the full cost of year-long programmatic and coaching support. Only two states, North Carolina and Nebraska, and 20 schools within each of these two states, were selected.

## USDA Awards \$99,256 Grant To Smithfield

The US Department of Agriculture Rural Development has awarded the Town of Smithfield \$99,256 for the Way finding Project. The award is part of a matching fund grant that will require the Town to contribute \$104,375 towards the \$203,631 project.

The Town of Smithfield will use the funds to purchase and install way finding signage to attract more people to the Downtown area. The project will support the development of small and emerging private business enterprises.

Town Manager Michael Scott said staff is working to secure locations for the gateway signs on both side of Highway 301 and Highway 70.

## Council Meeting Highlights

August 7, 2018

#### **Regular Meeting Summary:**



- 1. Chairperson Peggy Scott presented the Appearance Commission's Annual Report.
- 2. The Town Council approved entering into an agreement with Buffalo Road LLC for residential reimbursements.
- 3. The Town Council authorized the sale of property located at 916 Third Avenue by upset bid.
- 4. The Town Council approved a bid award to Central Builders in the amount of \$317,000 for riverbank refurbishments at the Water Plant
- 5. The Town Council approved Zoning Text Amendment ZA-18-04 allowing churches and placing of worship within retail shopping centers located in the B-3 zoning district
- 6. The Town Council approved Special Use Permit Request SUP-18-08, LifeSpring Church.
- 7. The Town Council tabled a decision on Zoning Text Amendment ZA-18-05 allowing on-site highrise identification signs on properties located within the B-3 zoning district and that are within 660 feet on the Interstate 95 right-of-way.
- 8. The Town Council approved Special Use Permit Request SUP-18-09, Market Street Automotive
- 9. The Town Council authorized the filing of an application to USDA for the financing of a 100 foot aerial platform ladder truck
- 10. The Town Council approved the Consent Agenda.
